INTRODUCTION

GROUP DISCUSSION

1. What are you learning right now in your marriage? If you are not married, what are you learning from the marriages around you?

4. The Bible says, “Marriage is a mystery.” Before you were married, what parts of marriage seemed most mysterious? Are there parts of marriage that still seem mysterious?
5. You have probably heard this passage at a wedding: [1 Corinthians 13:4-7](#).
4 Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. **5** It does not dishonor others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. **6** Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. **7** It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres.
 - a. Which description of love (from 1 Corinthians 13:4-7) challenges you the most?
 - b. Which description best describes your spouse? If you are not married, which characteristic are you most looking for in another person?

PRAYER

Today we discussed marriage as something God gave us to learn to give and serve. Take a few moments to talk to God silently. Ask him to give you wisdom of the mystery of marriage and to show you any steps he wants you to take today within your marriage or relationship.

As a group, pray out loud for yourselves and the person on your left using this guide:
